SCSD Parents/Guardians,


Greetings! The SCSD Board of Education made a few changes to our Covid-19 procedures and protocols at the meeting held on January 19, 2022. Effective today, asymptomatic close contacts do not have to quarantine, but they must wear a mask in all school and extracurricular activities and settings for ten (10) days from their designation as a close contact. If at any time during the ten days the student tests positive for Covid-19 or develops symptoms, the student must isolate for five days. Also, any close contact that does not wear a mask appropriately in school and extracurricular activities will be required to quarantine at home.

To support the efficient and effective response by the school district to all Covid-19 cases among our student body, a new Google Form has been created and added to the district website at www.scschools.org or is available at the following link: <https://forms.gle/Jhw34ZkkfVorykVk7>. If your child tests positive for Covid-19 or is identified as a close contact outside of school, please complete the form on the district's website. This form will be useful when evening or weekend test results are received by parents.

Finally, I would like to inform you that the SCSD Board of Education will vote on the issue of optional indoor masking at the February 16, 2022 school board meeting. Should the SCSD Board of Education authorize a change in masking policy, the change would take effect on February 21, 2022. You are being provided with this information so that you may plan accordingly as it relates to vaccinations. There are over 30 days from the date of this letter until the first potential day that masking may be optional in the school district. Please understand that if a policy change resulted in optional indoor masking, the federal masking mandate for transportation would still be in effect and enforced.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding as we move forward with providing the benefits of face-to-face instruction to the students of SCSD.
